Dear Grade 9 (Class of 2028) Students and Families:

Greetings from Dwight-Englewood!

I hope that you and your family are enjoying time together this summer and have been able to both rest and enjoy some adventure. I'm delighted and excited to welcome you to the 2024-2025 school year. I particularly want to welcome you to life as a ninth grade family. The Upper School is going to be an expansive and fun experience, and we want to be sure that both our students and families get off on the right foot.

There is a lot of information in this letter but it's all important so please be sure to read through this carefully. The ninth grade will be led by Dylan Bryant, who will serve as the Dean of the Class of 2028. Much of your communication from school will come from Mr. Bryant as we move through the year so please keep a special eye out for communications from him.

ORIENTING YOUR STUDENT TO THE UPPER SCHOOL

Because high school is a new experience for everyone, we will offer a number of orientation opportunities for both students and their families. We are excited to begin working in earnest to make our ninth graders feel known and comfortable. This process will begin on our first day of school when the Class gathers to meet one another, meet their Advisors, and spend time in those groups. In addition to advisors, each advisory will be matched with specially trained juniors and seniors whose goal is to help our new ninth graders navigate the many ups and occasional downs of the school year (we call them "Peer Mentors").

A tradition that we are thrilled to engage in once more is the ninth grade retreat. We will tell you a lot more about this wonderful experience as we get closer, but please know that all ninth graders will participate in this retreat from September 19 to September 20.

PARENT/GUARDIAN ORIENTATION SESSIONS

To assist parents and guardians in getting to know the Upper School, we have planned two (2) special orientations in addition to Back-to-School Night (which will be on September 26). These orientations are your chance to meet each of your student's teachers and hear about their classes.

• The first orientation is a general introduction to the Upper School and the ninth grade

program. You'll also have the chance to meet important people in the lives of ninth graders; including the Dean and your student's Advisor. That session will be held on the evening of Thursday, September 5 at 7:00 PM.

• The second orientation has been especially designed to introduce the mathematics program. It will be on Monday, September 16 at 7:00 PM.

More information will follow about both events, but please note the dates now as they are important programs to attend; both for families new to the school and those coming from our Middle School.

Besides the content of the meetings, these orientations are an important opportunity for you as parents and guardians to spend time talking with each other and forming the important family networks that will help you navigate the coming years. You will hear me say many times that knowing other parents is a wonderful resource, both about the high school in general but also about your student's social life. Especially during the first couple of years, having these relationships and connections will help you know more and feel more comfortable with the activities that start to occupy the social lives of the Class.

HEALTH & MEDICAL FORMS REMINDER

All students should have returned their updated, required medical and health forms, including any that require a signature from both parents/guardians and/or your child's physician, to the D-E Upper School Nurse, Christine Kim, by way of the Magnus Health Portal ("Magnus"). Any US student planning to join in our D-E Athletics Fall Teams Preseason must have all required forms uploaded by August 19. See below for additional details.

- Magnus issues periodic email updates to remind families that they need to complete their child's medical/health forms, and Magnus can be accessed from these emails.
 Parents/guardians can also access Magnus from the MyD-E Parent Resource Board; click here. Please note that LogIn to MyD-E is required to access Magnus. For MyD-E LogIn help and/or help with accessing Magnus, please email help@d-e.org or call 201-227-3177.
- Students will not be allowed to attend classes without the proper forms being completed.
- <u>All</u> students must complete the State of New Jersey Pre-participation Medical Form. Even if you live in New York State, the New Jersey form <u>must</u> be submitted.
- Forms uploaded to Magnus that require a physician's signature must <u>also be signed</u> <u>personally by your child's doctor: stamped signatures cannot be accepted</u>, according to New Jersey state law that we are obliged to follow.
- Other important pieces of information that must be updated to Magnus include permission for your child to participate in athletics, take school trips, medical/health

insurance forms, etc. Your child will not be allowed to participate in athletics or take trips if we do not receive this information.

- Students may not bring hard copies of signed/completed medical or health forms to practices. These will not be accepted and students will not be able to join practices until their forms are complete and uploaded to Magnus.
